



Autism and autism spectrum disorders (“ASDs”) are bio-neurological developmental disabilities adversely impacting the development of the brain. Individuals with autism or ASDs typically have diminished cognition, verbal and non-verbal communication, social interaction, and hampered leisure or play; additionally, they often suffer from numerous physical ailments which may include allergies, asthma, epilepsy, mental retardation, digestive disorders, persistent viral infections, sensory integration dysfunction.

Collectively, autism and ASDs are estimated to occur in approximately 7.5 per 1,000 Americans; males have been believed to be several times more likely than girls to be inflicted, but recent studies suggest that the condition is equally common with girls, and that milder symptoms tend to be better camouflaged in girls. Irrespective of the current gender balance debate, frequency is unaffected by race, gross geography, or social economic status. Currently, there is no cure for autism or ASDs, but symptoms can be significantly improved with early intervention and treatment
